

Leverage Ratio

The leverage ratio acts as a credible supplementary measure to the risk-based capital requirement. The Bank is required to maintain a minimum leverage ratio of 3.50% with effect from October 1, 2019. The Bank's leverage ratio as on June 30, 2026, calculated in accordance with the RBI guidelines is as follows:

The Bank's Leverage Ratio as on June 30, 2026, stands at 11.93%, calculated as Tier 1 Capital divided by Total On/Off-Balance Sheet exposure. The total exposure amounts to Rs. 2,15,415.00 Crore. The Tier 1 Capital is recorded at Rs 25,705.84 Crore. Changes in the regulatory requirement vide Reserve Bank of India (Commercial Banks – Prudential Norms on Capital Adequacy) Fifth and Sixth Amendment Directions, 2026 dated May 08, 2026 and May 18, 2026 respectively led to increase in the numerator and review of the CCF applicable on documentary letter of credits led to decrease in exposure measure during the quarter thereby improving the Leverage Ratio on quarterly basis.

The position remained above the minimum regulatory requirement of 3.5%. The available Tier 1 capital is sufficient for ongoing Balance Sheet growth on a non-risk adjusted basis.
